Letter from the Executive Director

This past year was another year of growth for NEPA Inclusive. With the changes to and new services offered through the PA ID Waiver 5-year renewal, NEPA Inclusive was able to expand the number of services offered and expand the number of people we support. Those changes



and the continual movement to inclusion, which starts with the wishes of the people we support, has meant that NEPA Inclusive continues to be a leader in inclusive services in the NEPA region. That leadership has meant that NEPA Inclusive is a preferred agency for people who want to live an inclusive life.

Over the past five years, we have grown into a full-service agency that can support someone for a few hours a week to 24-7 care; from job development to job finding to ongoing job support; and through transitions in their life, such as moving from their family home into their own apartment. This person-centered approach continually focuses on the individual's wishes and support needs and re-focuses when the person wants to refocus their goals.

The region we support has also grown. We started as a small start-up agency serving Luzerne and Lackawanna Counties. We now are also supporting people in Berks, Carbon, Columbia, Monroe, and Wyoming Counties. As we grow into those areas, people are continually saying that our approach is fresh, creative, different, and we are being welcomed more than we could have imagined.

As we continue on this journey of inclusion, we thank you for your past support and hope you will continue to see the value in continuing to invest in people's lives. We have big plans in place and think you will be excited to see them as we announce them over the coming years.

NEPA Inclusive is a provider of services for people with disabilities who have an 'ID Waiver for Service' through the Pennsylvania Office of Developmental Programs (ODP), Luzerne/Wyoming County Office of Mental Health and Developmental Services and Lackawanna County Office of Behavioral Health/Intellectual Disability/Early Intervention.

NEPA Inclusive is also a vendor with the Pennsylvania Office of Vocational Rehabilitation (OVR) for Job Finding, Job Coaching, Community Based Work Assessments. And Pre-Employment Transition Services (PETS), including Transition Academy/Group Program, Job Shadowing, Travel Training, Work Based Learning Experiences (WBLE), and Discovery and Customizable Employment.
