

This innovative program is all about making friends, having fun, and becoming employable! Over 10 months, high school aged students (14-21) will have fun in three transformative 10-week modules focused on: Self-Advocacy Skills, Daily Living Skills, & Workplace Preparation

TASC is located across six regions—Pittston, Lehigh Valley, Schuylkill County, Berks County, and the Poconos. Each week, students will participate in 2-hour sessions that promote personal growth and strengthen community connections.


In the past year, 195 individuals participated in our core modules:

- Self-Advocacy
- Workplace Readiness
- Life Skills

On average, participants demonstrated a 31-32% knowledge growth based on pre- and post-test scores. Each individual reported forming new friendships, and all completed a career interest inventory. Additionally, 33% of Self-Advocacy participants, 28% of Workplace Readiness participants, and 33% of Life Skills participants were connected to additional Employment Services, further advancing their career paths.



Meet Diane, a remarkable mother and one of our dedicated clients receiving IHCS services. As a woman with intellectual disabilities, Diane's strength and determination shine through in how she cares for her 15-year-old daughter and 13-year-old son. 

ITEP PROGRAM






The Inclusive Transitional Employment Program (ITEP) redefines the future for high school students with diverse abilities. Unlike traditional programs, ITEP extends beyond graduation, guiding students to meaningful community employment. Students gain practical experience in a genuine culinary arts and food service environment through hands-on training at real businesses like our bakery and coffee shop.

ITEP's dual focus makes it unique: providing practical training while preparing students for post-graduation employment. By collaborating with schools and local businesses, ITEP secures valuable job opportunities and continues to support students as they transition into the workforce. Whether they pursue careers within our bakery and coffee shop or explore other paths, ITEP is dedicated to achieving employment success for individuals with diverse abilities.


The Inclusive Transitional Employment Program (ITEP) is intended for high school students with Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) and/or 504 Plans who have job training and employment as a goal. This program is primarily tailored for students aged 14-21 attending high school. ITEP provides an opportunity for these students to receive hands-on training in the culinary arts and food service industry, with the ultimate goal of obtaining employment in community businesses, including our bakery and coffee shop.

We provide non-licensed Community-Based Services, including In-Home and Community Supports, Companion Services, Community Participation Supports (CPS), Supported Employment, Day Support, Supporting Living, and Housing Tenancy and Sustaining Services to adults with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities and Autism.

PA Inclusive is a vendor with the PA Office of Vocational Rehabilitation (OVR) for Pre-Employment Transition Services (PETS) and Adult Services in job development, job finding, and job coaching for students and adults.

Our services are available in the following PA counties: Berks, Bucks, Carbon, Columbia, Lackawanna, Lehigh, Luzerne, Monroe, Montgomery, Northampton, Northumberland, Pike, Schuylkill, and Wyoming.
